

Congratulations to this years newly elected State President Becky Shaw! P.A.C.A.R.'s state project this year named Lights, Camera, Action with PA C.A.R.! Becky chose to do a project that brings back a part of American History. This years state project will focus on raising funds up to \$1000.00 to restore films reels at James Buchanan's homestead, Wheatland. Wheatland is located right outside of downtown Lancaster. It served as President James Buchanan's home for a little over 20 years. In 1957, a day dedicated to James Buchanan was celebrated. At this time, Postmaster-General Arthur E. Summerfield unveiled the Wheatland postage stamp. This day was entitled "Wheatland Day." This day was to commemorate Buchanan's pioneering in international relations, his genius in diplomacy, and his love for friends, home, and family. At this event, there was the commemoration of the President, a pageant reenacting scenes from his presidency, which emphasized the importance of his family and friends, and lastly the commemoration of the first cable message between Great Britain and America. This day was

filmed on 16mm film reels and is unable to be viewed. Becky, along with help from P.A.C.A.R., wants to obtain these film reels and have them converted into another medium. Doing this will allow for the public and staff

members at Wheatland to see what happened at Wheatland on August 5, 1957. Thanks to every member for there generous support with Light, Camera, Action with P.A.C.A.R.!

2004-2005 National Project

If you were living around the time of the Battle of Monmouth you would know of its importance to the American Revolution. If you are like me, who was not living in 1778 then I will just have to fill you in. The Battle of Monmouth was one of the largest battles and the loss of British soldiers was three times the loss of American soldiers. As you can see this is an important aspect of American Revolution history and that is why this year's National Project is dedicated to educating our younger generations about the Battle of Monmouth. The staff at the Battle of Monmouth State Park is planning to create an original Battle of Monmouth coloring book. The historian Garry Wheeler Stone has employed the help of renowned historical children's coloring book artist Mr. Peter F. Copeland. Mr. Copeland's previous projects include books dedicated to George Washington, The American Revolution, and military uniforms. Mr. Copeland's books are historically accurate and educational because of his sense of detail. The coloring book will be created at Monmouth, where Mr. Copeland has agreed to work, and Mr. Stone will provide the research, the concept of the book, and the drafting text. Now you are probably wondering where C.A.R. fits into all of this. After Mr. Copeland sends the


