# Ensuring American Patriotism

Patrick Henry helped forward American history, he made many contributions that sparked the American revolution though many do not know him or only know him for his famous speech "Give me liberty or give me death." This year's national project supports schools across the country by providing them with DVDs about Patrick Henry. The Patriotic Education Committee has created this informational CD to help promote learning about Patrick Henry. It includes a biography of Patrick Henry, a timeline and many helpful website links.

## Patrick Henry Biography



Patrick Henry, one of the greatest historical contributors to our country, was born on May 29, 1736, in Hanover County, Virginia. In his lifetime he participated in every possible aspect of America's struggle for independence. He was a lawyer, a devout patriot, and a passionate speaker and changed our country for the better. We owe much to the dedication of Patrick Henry.

Patrick was taught at home by his father and taught himself law on his own time. In 1760 he took his attorney's examination and forever embedded himself in the history of not only Virginia but the entire country. Henry fought the Stamp Act in the House of Burgesses in 1765, going so far as to label it treason. He vehemently led Five Resolutions, four of which were ultimately approved, and won the support of the Burgesses. In 1775 Patrick Henry urged his fellow countrymen to pick up arms in self-defense against the British. It was then he spoke his most famous words, "I know not what course others may take; but as for me, give me liberty or give me death."

Patrick Henry was very actively involved in politics. He served in the Virginia House of Burgesses; he was a member of the Virginia Committee of Correspondence and a delegate to the Virginia Convention and to the Virginia Constitution Ratification Convention. He was actively involved in the May 6, 1776, convention and became the first governor of the commonwealth under its new constitution. Patrick Henry served five terms as governor of Virginia. He died in 1799 at his home on Red Hill Plantation.


# 2009 Potowmack Ball
