

### Cycling through the Ages

#### American History Chairman

As the spring weather and sunny days finally arrive, one of my favorite activities to do is to go on a bike ride around the neighborhood. With State President Fay Totman's theme being *Going Miles for Smiles*, C.A.R. members across Pennsylvania will be cycling a lot this year. May is *National Bike Month*, and did you celebrate? I encourage all local societies to learn the history of the bicycle at their next meeting and how it became a favorite pastime across America.

An early bicycle had been developed by a German inventor in the early 1800s, and the French participated in a bike riding phase in the early 1820s. Although the use of bicycles was becoming more common, the first bicycle, at this time called a velocipede, was patented in America in 1819, by W. K. Clarkson, Jr. This prompted a short-lived bicycle craze in the late 1860s. Bike-riding in America reappeared ten years later, and Albert A. Pope worked as the first bicycle manufacturer in America. Women suffrage movements employed the bicycle as a tool for empowerment. It allowed women to travel freely and participate in outdoor activities, and the motion required to work a bicycle allowed women's clothing to evolve and fashions to become less restrictive. Suffragists Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony were fans of these new contraptions.

A national bicycle club called the League of American Wheelmen was formed in 1880, now known as the League of American Bicyclists. The bike continued to evolve in crazy ways throughout the 19th century and today people all over the world enjoy bicycles as a way of transportation, exercise, or to spend time with friends. 
